Return to School for 1st, 2nd, 3rd & Transition Year students.

Dear Parent/Guardian, Students,

I hope that you and your family are well at this time. We want to thank you for your co-operation in helping your child access remote learning this term. It hasn't been easy on anyone and if you have any concerns about your child that you would like us to be aware of, please get in touch with your child's class tutor or Year Head.

I am writing to you to outline important details relevant to the return of your son/daughter to Creagh College on Monday 12th April 2021 at 8.45am. We are delighted to be welcoming back all 1st, 2nd, 3rd and Transition Year students to the building. When students return to school, they will follow the normal school hours and timetable.

The canteen service will operate as normal. Students should pre-order from the canteen before school in order to reduce queues at break times. School buses will run as normal.

Student Returning to School Declaration Form

A declaration form must be completed for each student returning to school. This form must be completed by Parent/Guardians or by students 18 years and older. The link to the form has been distributed via text message and on student platforms in the school. Covid-19

It is important that the return is conducted in a safe controlled manner. Our students have excelled in their adherence to the Covid Measures in the school and I would like to take this opportunity to highlight some of these.

- Students should arrive before 8.50am in full uniform, wearing a face mask
- Students enter and exit through the entrance at the front of the school as before
- Students must adhere to the one-way system throughout the school
- Students must not congregate outside either at the start or the end of the school day.

Physical Distancing outside of the classroom

One of the times which poses most risk to students is at break times when students have to remove masks to eat. We would strongly encourage students to eat outdoors, at the new picnic benches, or in the carpark and to be diligent about maintaining 2m social distance. **The new strain of Coronavirus is much more transmissible than it was when students were last in the school building so each student needs to be more aware of their own**

responsibilities. Students will also be reminded of these procedures/measures within the school at online assemblies tomorrow (Friday March 26th).

- 1st Years; Period 2 (9.40am)
- 2nd Years; Period 5 (12.00pm)
- 3rd Years; Period 3 (10.20am)
- Transition Years; Period 4 (11.20am).

We would like to remind parents that the school day finishes at 12.40 tomorrow, Friday 26th March, in order to facilitate a staff meeting.

Attending School

Students showing any symptoms of Covid-19 should not attend school and seek medical advice. These symptoms include;

- Fever/High Temperature (38°C or higher)
- New cough
- Shortness of breath or breathing difficulties
- Loss or change of your sense of taste/smell.

Students are required not to return to or attend school in the event of the following:

- Students who have been identified as close contacts by HSE should not return to school.
- Students who live with someone showing symptoms of the virus should not attend school.
- Students who have travelled outside of Ireland – in such instances, families should follow the most recent advice with regards foreign travel.

Students developing symptoms in school should report this to their Teacher immediately.

Students and their families are required to co-operate with any public health officials and the school for contact tracing purposes and to follow any public health advice in the event of a case or outbreak in the school.

In order to help your child settle back in to school, our teachers have agreed to having a homework free week in the first week back.
